Outdoor Learning

- Finding the physical border between Scotland and England, visit different areas on both sides of the border
- Discuss some of the famous land marks in Scotland and England, visit local ones and record in the outdoor journals

RE (Festivals/Celebrations)

- Learn about the different churches that are found in the different countries
- Discover where there are places of worship locally and visit these
