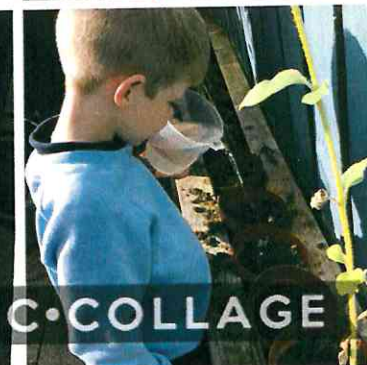
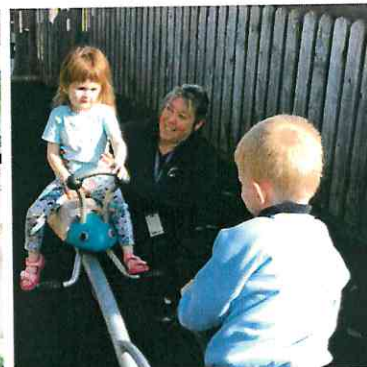


Our Theme this term is Holy Island and Lindisfarne.

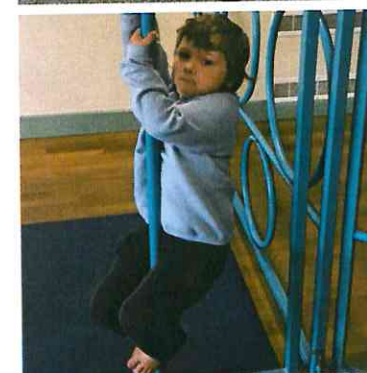


September 2020

We have enjoyed learning through play outside by engaging in open ended activities and by using our senses to explore the world around us.



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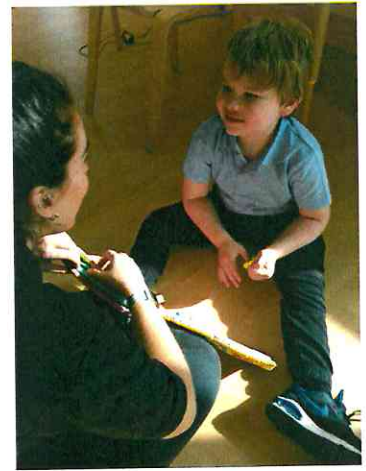
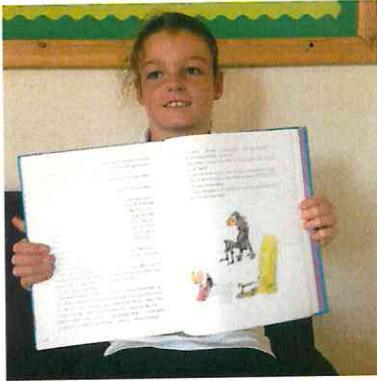
Beech Class
