

Dear Parent/Guardian,

We are still enjoying being post Ofsted and are so proud of what the school has achieved the report reflected the brilliant practice that is evident across school at all times of the day with all our pupils. I am so proud of everyone and you our parents are part of the team as much as we are, so thank you.

We are enjoying the improving weather and getting out and about in the local community. The classes are enjoying visits to the beach and parks, as well as the odd treat at a café!

We have been involved in setting up a Wild Life Garden in Allanton Village as part of Oak class working towards their John Muir award. The pupils worked so hard to get the garden looking lovely and attracting insects, birds and mammals to the area. We will continue to maintain this on a regular basis so that we did not just start it but are part of developing it further over time.

This is part of our work to be a Green Flag school again, an accreditation that we held some years ago and would like to do so again. We are trying to ensure that the food we use in school is locally sourced, we now have locally sourced, vegetables and fruit where possible, eggs and meat. We also get our milk delivered by a milk person and in glass bottles. We are trying hard to reduce waste including plastics, if your child has a packed lunch can you think about using paper bags or reusable plastic containers. We are also collecting crisp packets to be recycled.

We will be interviewing for a new teaching assistant, when we have made the appointment I will update you on who it is. We will also be contacting you before at some point if your child will be moving classes, we do not anticipate many changes this year, either with pupils or staff.

We have heard some lovely success stories about past pupils recently, one young man is now employed at Marks and Spencer's, one is completing their second year of a Child Care course at Northumberland College, another is completing her first year on the same course. One of our past pupils is taking up an apprenticeship at Mercedes's in Coldstream and is employed at Tesco's in Berwick as well as attending college. We are so proud of all our young people and it is lovely to hear about how well they are doing.




























Beech Class
