These results show that the pupils in the Pupil Premium group are all making progress in the area of Emotional Well-being, this is one of the areas that we are targeting with the Pupil Premium funding, for example the payment of Mrs Katie Master, Massage Therapist and the introduction of Equine Therapy.

External Moderation

School continues to moderate with our mainstream colleagues and meetings are arranged to moderate Early Years data. We continue to moderate with Barndale House Special School to ensure that our P-Scale results are accurate and that teacher assessments as reflected in the B-squared results are fair and accurate. We are working with the Northumberland Special School headteachers group to find ways in which we can moderate our new MAPP assessment baselines to ensure that we are being accurate in the levels that we are assessing the pupils at.

Attendance - figures continue to be affected because of: -

- Complex, epilepsy and seizures that medicine cannot control/prevent which
 is now impacting upon the attendance of two pupils on an ongoing basis. One
 of these pupils has only recently started having seizures so will need to be
 carefully monitored to see if the medication prescribed is working to
 control this seizure pattern.
- Specialist medical consultant appointments: Neurological, surgical, paediatric, orthopaedic etc. at Edinburgh, Newcastle and Melrose
- Orthotic and specialist dental appointments.

There have been requests agreed for holidays during term time because of the children's extenuating medical, health and social needs, going on holiday at quieter times of the years makes doing so safer and easier on a practical basis for these children's families. We are also now working with the Education Welfare Officer each half term to analyse any absences and to ensure that should there be any concerns these are addressed. The current attendance figures are: - School year to date - 95.32%, this has improved further since the previous Headteachers report.

Behaviour/Discipline/Exclusion Information

We have no reported incidents of Racism and have sent in a Nil return recording this.

We have no formal reports of bullying since the last Governors report, however the headteacher has dealt with one request regarding concerns from a parent. The parent reported that their young person had concerns relating to the way other young people where behaving towards them. This was dealt with through Emotional Literacy work, staff meetings and ensuring that the young person in question was monitored closely, without drawing attention to them to ensure there could not be any repeat of any behaviours that maybe upsetting. The parents were informed of these plans and where happy with them, no formal complaint was made.

Care Plans - Medical Needs

Care plans continue to be updated with support from Kerry Thompson school nurse. We have now got 6 children with Epilepsy care plans and 1 child with a care plan for choking. All staff that work with these pupils have received training on how to follow the care plans. These plans are now in place; we are also updating all training in regard to these plans.

We have all received up to date First Aid training and some staff will be attending the Peadiatric First Aid training in the near future.

Complaints Information

We have received no formal complaints through official or un-official pathways. We will invite parents to contribute to their child's annual review this enables the parents to bring up any concerns that they may have, we will then work with the parents to ensure that we address these issues.

School Development Plan

<u>Staff Continuing Professional Development (CPD) - linked to Appraisal/School Development Plan</u>

Please see attached Continuing Professional Record spread sheet. This spreadsheet has been developed to show the triangulation between, the School Development Plan and professional development and training.

I have completed observations of all class leads, the lesson observations were 100% 'outstanding'. The changes that we have put in place in September is ensuring that teaching and learning is at the highest level at all times, as observed through lesson observations. A copy of these are available from the headteacher.

Admissions

We had three new starts in September 2017, one in Elm, one in Beech and one in Sycamore. We are supporting another pupil with three sessions in school, this is with a view to the pupil transferring at some point this academic year. This would take our numbers to 46 on our register, although 2 of these pupils are nursery places and attend for 15hrs.

Post School Planning

This is an area of focus this year, we are working with all Post 16 providers in the area and out with the area to develop clearer pathways to be published on our website to try and explain the processes for Post 16 planning.

We have currently secured a college place for one pupil to complete their level one Child Care qualification from January to July, whilst still being a Grove School pupil, then moving onto their level 2 next September, we are all very proud of the young person and know that they will make a great success of the course.

Transition Plans

These are being completed with support from all the multi-professionals that are involved in supporting the pupil and with agreement from the parents and young people themselves. We are currently working with Rachel Usher, Transition Worker to develop a transition plan for each pupil.

Work experiences

We continue to work closely with Tesco to develop work experience opportunities for pupils. We have also organised work experience for another young person at Tweedmouth Middle School, as they are interested in working with young people. These generally take place in the summer term and we will ensure that those pupils for which it is appropriate are supported to experience a work placement. We also facilitate work experience in our school, some of our pupils may go and

work with younger pupils, and this means that they are in a familiar setting but are experiencing the demands of a work place.

Staff Absence Data/Staffing Information

We have experienced a difficult start to the year, we as a school and governing body have supported the staff through some very tragic situations, this has been to try and help our staff to return to work when they feel able to. We continue to follow procedures for the management of staff absences, as part of this process staff have return to work meetings and the relevant paperwork is completed.

We have appointed Mrs Kerry Scott and Miss Charlotte Hattle as additional teaching assistants, as well as two apprentices, one who is a classroom assistant apprentice, Miss Tazmin Patterson and one who is an administration apprentice, Miss Rachael Younger. These staff are already bringing a great deal to the team with new ideas and strategies that they have used in previous roles.

Governors audit results

We are completing the audit again to see where we may still have areas that need to be developed, the results of this will be reported at committee meetings in the new year.

Staff Appraisal and Salaries

Staff appraisals have taken place and the attached report highlights the areas that staff are looking at developing over the next academic year.

Discipline/Grievance Issues

There continues to be no such issues to report on.

Buildings

We are continuing to look for alternative options for the boiler, including the possibility of transferring the boiler to gas, this would prevent us needing oil deliveries and having an oil tank there are health and safety issues associated with this. This is ongoing and we will need to wait for the budget to be in a position to carry out this work.

The building work planned for the summer has been completed and we are very pleased with the new classroom and meeting spaces that have been developed.

Academy Status

Academy status remains part of the political landscape, this means that we need to continue to think about what our long term options are. Berwick Academy are currently in discussions with The Three Rivers Academy, Morpeth and we will watch to see what happens with this development.

We continue to have discussions with Hexham Priory School about their Academy status bid with the Eden MAT from London.
